Verses are by ONE cantor, chant-style (non-metered, second vthm) and g any one of the four melodies, depending on their vocal range. Verses are not designed for multiple single rmonies.

For the **accompanist**, the rhythm resumes (a to be on the last of each verse to bring choir and congregation in for the refrain, which then has **choir** harmont beere on out.

We like to do a double refrain after the last verse has close the song, so we use the turnaround accompaniment for repeating the refrain, then the Final ending at the versel.

Psalm Tones:

Overall, we have 16 different medians to the hout the hundreds of different psalm refrains to shout the one per psalm refrain. We give two options from which the cantor can choose, depending to excantor's vocal range.

This way, a cantor doesn't have to learn hund. If different verse melodies over the three-year cycle.

The particular psalm to being matched to this are Psalm Tone 14 in F, which starts up a third from the end of the refrain (Mi in second of the refrain (Do in solfege).


